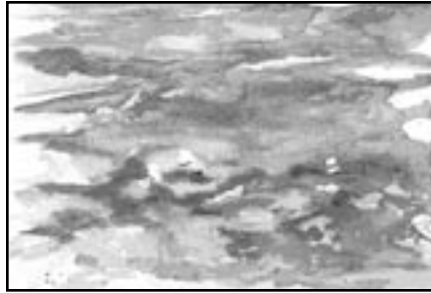

Slices of Light**

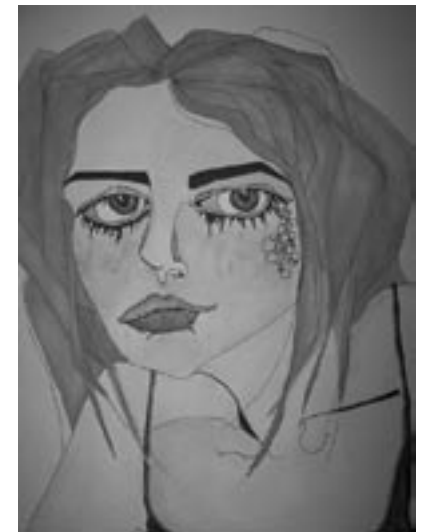
